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Annual Report: Canadian Heartland Community AED Challenge

Canadian Heartland changed how it donated Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to communities in Lanark—Frontenac—Lennox & Addington in 2012.

What is Canadian Heartland?

Well, way back in 2001, MPs gave themselves a raise. I thought we made enough money already, so I asked the folks in my riding what I should do with it. They decided I should take the raise and give it to charity. One of the suggested charities was providing AEDs.

So I started Canadian Heartland and partnering with the ACT Foundation to help improve heart attack survival rates in our riding.

So far I've given over \$270,000 towards placing AEDs in local arenas and community buildings, with fire departments, and in police cars. It also helped fund CPR and AED training in all the high schools in our riding.

What is the change?

Originally, I just took the money and

bought defibrillators and gave them to places that would maximize their potential.

We have covered a lot of ground, having placed 16 AEDs to date. I know of one incident in which an AED we placed in the Carleton Place arena was used to save a life.

The "Community AED Challenge" was created and we asked local organizations to suggest locations with the proviso that they raised some of the money for the purchase of the AEDs and the associated training. A special committee made up of individuals from each of the counties' ambulance services met and made the final selections of locations.

Representatives from the ambulance services were chosen because they are most knowledgeable of where AEDs are located in their respective counties and where they are needed.

Through the Community AED Challenge we asked the local organizations to pay part of the cost, so we were able to increase the number of AEDs we could af-

ford to purchase.

The first recipients!

The Community AED Challenge was a success. I figured that the local organizations in our riding would step up, and they didn't disappoint! In all, Canadian Heartland awarded a total of seven new AEDs through the Community AED challenge.

What is next?

The thing about AEDs is that the closer you are to one when a heart attack hits, the more likely you are to survive. That means looking at new ways to get AEDs and people trained in CPR near to high risk individuals.

This is a difficult task in a riding as sparsely populated as ours, but I truly believe it is doable.

That is why we are always looking for new ways to meet this challenge.

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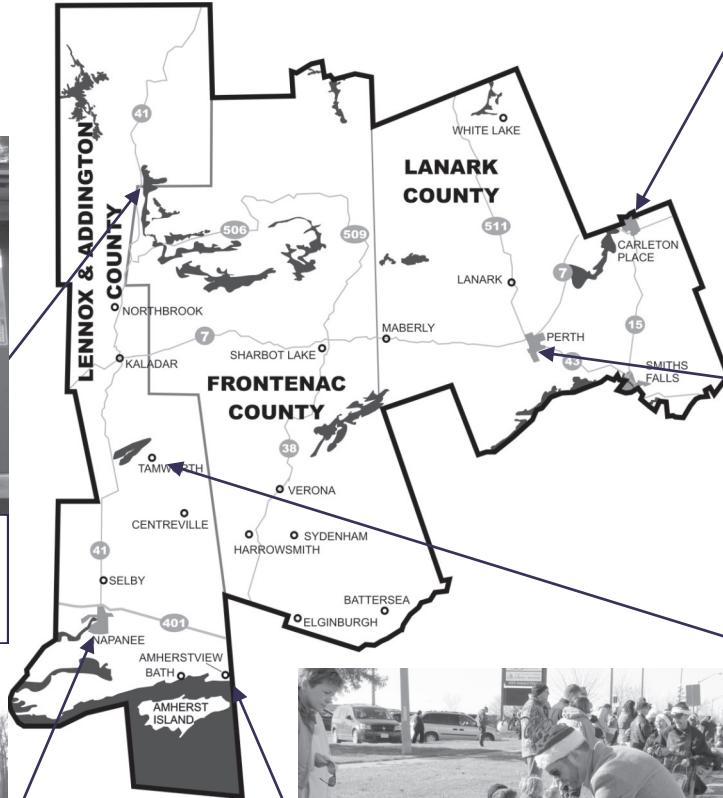
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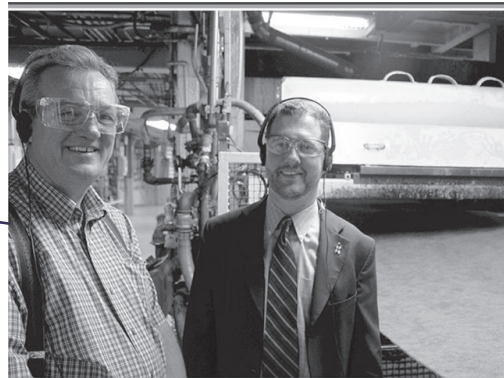
